## *Support for social services organisations*

A key point of Section 7AA of the Oranga Tamariki Act for OT contracted providers is the requirement for improved outcomes for tamariki Māori.

Strategically, organisations will need to demonstrate they have strong relationships with tāngata whenua and the capability to work effectively with tamariki and whānau to deliver improved, measurable outcomes.

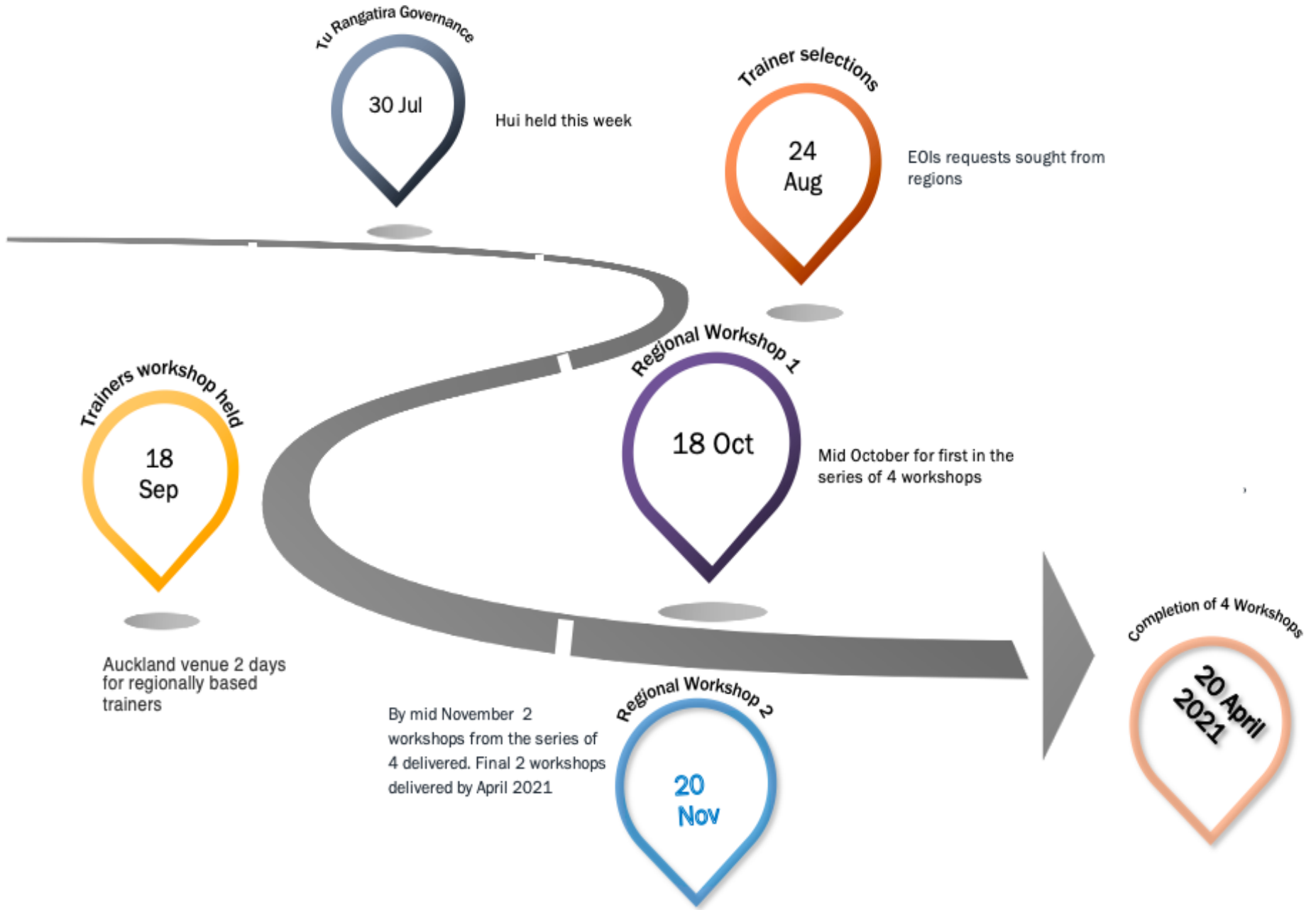

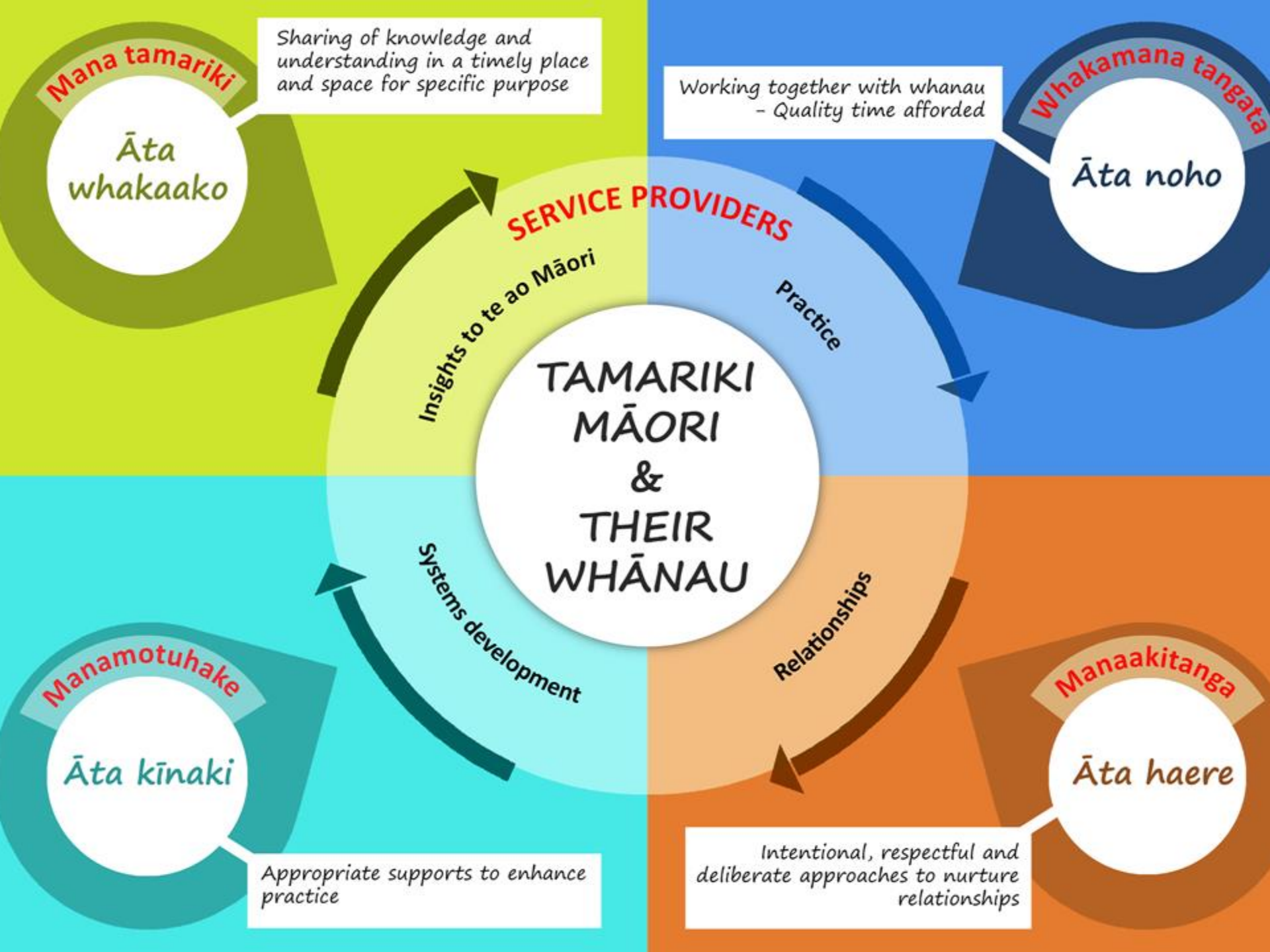

# ĀTA: Growing Respectful Relationships

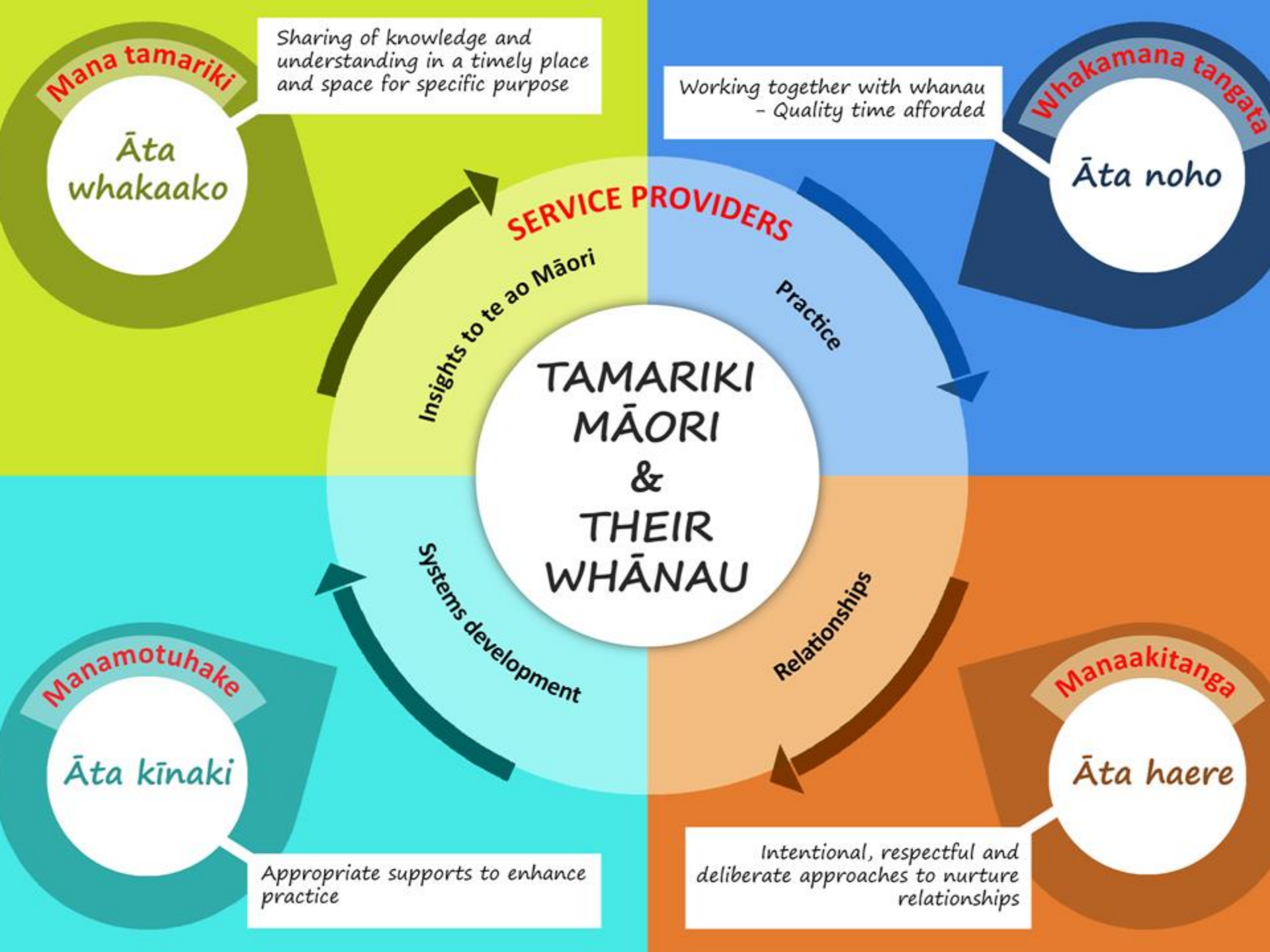
- ✓ Gently reminds people how to behave when engaging with people, kaupapa & environments
- ✓ Intensifies peoples perceptions in – quality space of time (wā) and place (wāhi), reciprocity, respectfulness, reflection, effort and energy, discipline and transformation
- ✓ Incorporates the notion of planning
- ✓ Incorporates the notion of strategising
- ✓ Focuses on relationships, creates and holds safe space
